

The Certificates and Ratings




Difference between a certificate and a rating

While these terms are often used interchangeably, they actually refer to distinct qualifications in aviation. A certificate typically refers to a broader qualification, such as a Private Single Engine Land (PSEL) or Commercial Single Engine Land (CSEL), which denotes the level of pilot privileges and qualifications. Ratings, on the other hand, are additional qualifications added to a certificate that authorize a pilot to operate specific types of aircraft or under certain conditions, such as an Instrument Rating or Multi-Engine Rating.

The Academies

Our training program is structured into distinct academies to ensure specialized and focused instruction for each stage of your pilot education. Each academy is led by specialized instructors who are experts in their respective fields, ensuring that you receive the highest quality training tailored to your specific certification or rating. Each academy oversees the following certificates/ratings:



Ground Training

Ground school is the portion of pilot training where you learn the theoretical aspects of aviation while on the ground, either online or in a classroom with an instructor. This includes understanding aerodynamics, navigation, weather, aircraft systems, flight planning, regulations, and safety procedures. Ground school provides the foundational knowledge necessary to become a competent and safe pilot. We provide three types of ground school; online ground school, one-on-one instructor time, and group grounds. Let's go over each in a little more detail below.



ONLINE GROUND SCHOOL

You'll have access to our online ground school platform, King Schools, before you arrive. We want you to complete at least the Private, Instrument, and Commercial written exams to reduce stress in an already demanding training program. This preparation allows you to fully concentrate on flight training, making the program more efficient and less stressful. Additionally, studying the material beforehand ensures that concepts are not completely unfamiliar, easing your transition into our intensive training environment.

ONE-ON-ONE WITH INSTRUCTOR

Our one-on-one ground instruction offers you personalized training tailored to your individual needs. During these one-on-one sessions, you'll work closely with an experienced instructor who will provide focused guidance, answer your questions, and ensure you thoroughly understand key concepts. This personalized approach helps reinforce your learning and address any areas where you need additional support.





GROUP GROUNDS

Our group ground sessions bring together students working toward the same certificate or rating, creating a collaborative and interactive learning environment. Led by experienced instructors, these classes encourage group discussions, shared insights, and collective problem-solving. You'll benefit from the diverse perspectives of your peers while covering essential topics and preparing for exams and flight lessons.

Flight Training

Flight training is the hands-on portion of your education where you'll learn to operate an aircraft in various conditions and scenarios. You will gain practical experience in the cockpit, mastering essential skills such as takeoffs, landings, navigation, maneuvers, and emergency procedures. Each certificate and rating is structured to provide initial exposure to its specific purpose, followed by advanced training and preparation for a checkride for that certificate/rating. The checkride will be the test of your skills and knowledge obtained for that specific certificate/rating. Upon passing that test, you will receive that certificate or rating.



BECOMING A PILOT

PSEL & IFR

The initial phase of your flight training focuses on obtaining your Private Pilot Certificate and Instrument Rating. As a Private Pilot, you'll learn the basics of aircraft operation, including pre-flight procedures, basic maneuvers, and safe handling of the aircraft. Once you master these fundamentals, you'll move on to Instrument training, which teaches you how to fly in various weather conditions using only the aircraft's instruments. This foundational training sets the stage for more advanced certifications and builds your confidence as a pilot.

BECOMING A COMMERCIAL PILOT

CSEL & CMEL

The next phase of your training involves obtaining your Commercial Single-Engine and Multi-Engine Certificates, making you a more advanced and skilled pilot. This portion of your training allows you to get paid for your flying (although it's not to become an airline pilot—that requires an ATP rating, which you pursue after accumulating 1500 hours of flight time). With a commercial certificate, you can work as a flight instructor (once you obtain your CFI certificate), Part 135 charter pilot, aerial photographer, skydiving pilot, and more. The training includes advanced maneuvers, complex aircraft operations, and understanding the responsibilities of a commercial pilot in both single and multi-engine aircraft.








BECOMING A FLIGHT INSTRUCTOR

CFI, CFII & MEI

The final phases of your training includes becoming a Certified Flight Instructor (CFI), Certified Flight Instructor Instrument (CFII), and Multi-Engine Instructor (MEI). By the end of the program, you will be qualified to teach in all the airframes and conditions (IFR) you trained in. This phase not only enhances your piloting skills but also prepares you to pass on your knowledge to new students, ensuring they receive the same high-quality training. As an instructor, you'll have the ability to inspire and guide future pilots, further cementing your expertise in aviation.

What Is a Checkride?

A checkride is the final assessment of your skills and knowledge for a specific pilot certificate or rating. Conducted by a designated pilot examiner (DPE), this evaluation ensures that you meet the standards set by the Federal Aviation Administration. The checkride is split into two stages: the ground (or oral) portion, where your theoretical knowledge is tested, and the flight (or practical) portion, where your flying skills are evaluated. At Blue Line Aviation, we prepare you thoroughly for your checkride throughout your training, ensuring you are not only prepared to pass, but to excel as a professional pilot. Successfully completing the checkride grants you the certificate or rating you've been training for, marking a significant milestone in your journey to becoming a skilled and certified pilot.



We understand the industry's DPE shortage; however, this is not an issue for us here at Blue Line. We mitigate this issue by employing inhouse DPEs and collaborating with local and out-of-state DPEs (yes, we even fly DPEs in from other states), ensuring efficient scheduling and timely completion of checkrides, even during peak periods.

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Admission Requirements

- 18 Years of Age
- High School Diploma or GED (College experience preferred)
- Two-Character References (One professional and one personal)
- Good Driving Record
- Pass a Criminal Background Check
- Initial FAA written tests (PAR, IRA and CAX) are required to be completed prior to start date.
- Remaining written tests (FII, FOI and FIA) are highly recommended to be completed prior to start date.

- No Prior Aviation Incidents or Accidents or other FAA Enforcement Actions
- Obtain an FAA First Class Medical Certificate
- Proficient in the English Language
- Height and Weight Limits (Due to aircraft operational limitations, students taller than 6'3" or weighing more than 250 lbs. may be unable to train in our aircraft)
- Must be of Good Moral Character, Must be Driven, Strong Work Ethic, Etc.

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

Upon graduating from Blue Line Aviation with approximately 200-250 flight hours, you'll need to build up to 1500 hours to qualify for the airlines. Entry-level pilot career options provide an excellent pathway to accumulate these hours while gaining valuable experience. Opportunities include becoming a skydive pilot, conducting aerial photography, crop dusting, and more. One of the most rewarding paths is instructing, where you can continue to hone your skills and share your knowledge with new students. This leads us to explore the opportunities and benefits of becoming an instructor at our flight school.

Becoming a Blue Line Instructor

Joining the ranks of some of the best instructors in the industry at Blue Line Aviation is an exceptional opportunity. CARGO

Opt for cargo flying if you prefer a focus on transporting goods rather than passengers. This path offers unique schedules and the opportunity to work with a variety of aircraft, often leading to high-demand roles in the industry. You might start with companies like Mountain Air Cargo or Ameriflight, which can eventually lead to positions with major companies like UPS, FedEx, or Amazon.





CORPORATE

Corporate flying allows you to work for private companies or individuals, providing personalized service and flexibility. This career path often involves flying sophisticated aircraft and offers the chance to build strong professional relationships. Examples include working for companies like Google, Goldman Sachs, or private charter services, etc.


All Costs To Be Considered

1ST CLASS MEDICAL	\$100 - \$200	We require a 1st class medical to ensure you meet airline health standards and avoid discovering disqualifying conditions when you apply for your ATP certificate to fly for the airlines. AMEs (Aviation Medical Examiners) set the prices.	
STUDENT SUPPLIES	\$900 - \$3000	Headset, books, all the way down to pen and paper. The costs associated with student supplies can wildly vary based on what you need, don't need, and/or preferred supplies (i.e. used iPad mini over new iPad Pro). You can find a full list of student supplies that you will need on the last page of our Flight School Expense Checklist. Click here to download that checklist.	
HOUSING	\$950 x Duration of Program	We offer student housing to alleviate the stress of finding accommodations during your training and to avoid the need for a year-long lease when you can graduate in as little as 5.5 months. To accurately calculate the cost of student housing, multiply the monthly rate by the number of months for your chosen program. The monthly cost shown includes rent, utilities, and internet.	
CHECKRIDE FEES	PSEL, IFR, CSEL,CFII, CMEL AND MEI \$1100 - \$1600 Per Checkride CFI \$1900 - \$2400 Per Checkride	Checkride fees vary as each DPE sets their own rates, and prices can differ by location. To estimate your total checkride fees, add up the fees for all the certificates and ratings you plan to obtain, and we recommend calculating based on the higher end of the cost range to be safe. These fees can change during your training, so it's best to budget conservatively. CFI checkrides usually have higher prices due to their longer duration. If you need to retake a checkride, there is typically a retest fee, which is usually half of the initial checkride fee. If you finance your checkride fees, any remaining amount leftover will be paid towards your flight school loan.	
WRITTEN EXAM FEES	~\$175 Per Exam	There are six written exams you may need to take, depending on the certificates and ratings you're pursuing. Identify which exams are required for your program (which you can find in the Career Pilot Program Overview chapter) and add up the costs for your total. The exams include PAR (Private), IRA (Instrument), CAX (Commercial), FOI and FIA (Instructor), and FII (Instrument Instructor). If you already have your Private certificate, you can exclude the PAR exam. For your convenience, our NC location has an in-house testing center.	
RENTERS INSURANCE	~\$70 / Month or \$420 / Year	Students are required to have renter's insurance for the duration of their training. The minimum coverage needed is \$50,000 for full hull damage or 10% of the aircraft value, whichever is higher, and \$500,000 in liability coverage. We highly recommend SkyWatch for monthly coverage; more information is available here . Annual insurance options from Southwest Aviation Insurance or AVEMCO are also available. If you choose AVEMCO, let them know you're renting from Blue Line Aviation and use the code BL01 for a discount.

Other Cost Considerations

FEES WITH FINANCING

Our lenders have a fee called an origination fee. An origination fee associated with financing is a one-time charge imposed by the lender to cover the administrative costs of processing a loan application. It's typically calculated as a percentage of the total loan amount and is paid upfront when the loan is originated. This fee is separate from interest charges and varies depending on the lender and the type of financing arrangement.


DEPOSITS AND WHEN THEY ARE DUE

Deposits are a financial commitment made towards securing a service or reservation, such as enrollment in our training program, without being an additional cost. They are typically required at various stages, such as during enrollment or before the start date, and will be deducted from the total program cost. The deposit schedule will be fully detailed by your training advisor when discussing financing options, ensuring clarity on when payments are due throughout your training journey.
